The following will be a voluntary taped statement taken from MR. WILLIAM CHARLES WINDHURST, W/M, DOB 10/22/47 who resides at 232 N.E. 23rd Ave., Apt. #2, Pompano Beach, Florida. This statement is in reference to certain knowledge and information that MR. WINDHURST may possess concerning a homicide/murder of ADAM WALSH that occurred on or about Monday 7/27/81, occurring at 300 Hollywood Mall, City of Hollywood, Broward County, Florida. This statement is being taken by DET. R. HICKMAN #0434 and DET. JACKIE HOFFMAN #0038 of the Hollywood Police Dept. and is being obtained at MR. WINDHURST's residence located at 232 N.E. 23rd Ave., Apt. #2, Pompano Beach, Florida and is commencing on Wednesday, 1/27/82 at 11:05 A.M.

Q. MR. WINDHURST, before I obtain this statement from you by virtue of my commission as Notary Public at large in and for the State of Florida, I am going to place you under oath for your testimony. Do you understand what it is to be placed under oath?

A. Yes I do.

Q. Would you raise your right hand. Do you solemnly swear the information you are about to relate in this statement will be the truth, the whole truth so help you God?

A. Yes I do

Q. For the record MR. WINDHURST would you state your complete given name, your date of birth and your local address?

A. Since I was discharged from the Army in 1970, late '69.

Q. Have you resided in Pompano all of that time or have you had other addresses?
A. I lived in Coconut Creek, I first lived in Coconut Creek with my family.

Q. Does your parents still live here?
A. Yes they do, my mother and sister live in Deerfield.

Q. What is their address in Deerfield?
A. 222 North Federal Highway

Q. And their last name?
A. WINDHURST and my sister's name is MRS. O'NEIL

Q. Is there a telephone number for them?
A. Yes there is. My mother's phone number is 421-2361 and my sister's phone number is 426-1341.

Q. Concerning your military service, what branch of the service were you in?

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A. I was in the Army.

Q. And how long of time were you in?

A. From early '68 to late '69 roughly

Q. What branch of the Army were you in?

A. I was in ...I was a helicopter crew chief in the Army.

Q. The discharge you received from the U.S.Army, is it honorable?

A. Yes it is honorable

Q. Did you serve the full tenior time that you enlisted for?

A. I got an early out cause I was in a combat zone and when I got back to the states I had less than 6 months so all troups got an early out.

Q. Were you in Viet Nam?

A. Yes I was

Q. MR. WINDHURST, how long have you resided at this particular address?

A.

Q. Approximately?

A. I'd say four-four and a half years roughly.

Q. And what is your occupation?

A. I'm a union laborer?

Q. Are you currently employed?

A. I'm unemployed at the present time.

Q. You are a union laborer that means you belong to the union?

A. Yes, I've been a member of local since 1972.

Q. Local number what?

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Q. And that is based where?

A. In Ft. Lauderdale

Q. Since 19 when?

A. 1972

Q. Now you are just in between jobs because of no work available, is that what it is?

A. Work is tight now yes.

Q. Have you ever been arrested?

A. Yes I have

Q. And for what?

A. For speeding in a boat and reckless operation of a motor boat.

Q. And anything else?

A. I've been arrested for shoplifting at Sears and Roebuck.

Q. How many times?

A. One time

Q. Not including Sears but any other places have you been arrested for theft?

A. No

MR.. WILLIAM CHARLES WINDHURST HAVING APPEARED BEFORE ME A NOTARY PUBLIC AT LARGE IN AND FOR THE STATE OF FLORIDA AND AFTER HAVING BEEN DULY SWORN DEPOSES AND STATES:

Q. MR. WINDHURST would you relate to us what knowledge you have concerning the murder of ADAM WALSH that occurred on or about Monday, 7/27/81, 300

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Hollywood Mall in Broward County, Florida, City of Hollywood. What I am concerned about is you have knowledge of a man known as EDWARD HAROLD JAMES who lives in (correction) who used to live in aparment #1 at this address. How long have you known that man?

A. I've known ED JAMES the entire period that I have lived here in this apartment which is like I say roughly 4-4½ years.

Q. When you moved in the apartment was JAMES already living there?

A. Yes ED JAMES was living here prior to me coming here.

Q. Was he living alone when you moved in or with someone?

A. Yes, he was always alone.

Q. When you moved in in 19...what ever it was approximately 4 years ago, did JAMES at that time own a brown 1973 Plymouth Fury 4 door?

A. Yes he did

Q. He's had that car all that time as far as you know?

A. Yes. he has

Q. You got a hold of myself and DET. HOFFMAN yesterday being Tuesday, 1/26/82 in the afternoon hours to tell us certain information that you felt was important concerning MR. JAMES. You mentioned to us that you were presen when the Pompano Police arrested him November 18th for an offense he did here in Pompano and you also mentioned that some time during July or August of 1981 that JAMES was missing for a two week period?

A. Yes he was, correct.

Q You also mentioned that some time during that two week period when he

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had come back that he had changed the seat cover on the front seat of his automobile?

A. That's correct

Q. Why did you take exception to MR. JAMES?

A. I had known MR. JAMES personally for the number of years that I lived here and we often discussed cars. I had seen him outside that morning. He was cleaning his car as he usually had done quite often.

Q. Does he take pretty good care of that vehicle?

A. Yes he did and it was immaculate I'd say 90% of the time.

Q. Have you ever sat inside that vehicle?

A. No I haven't

Q. Have you ever looked inside that vehicle?

A. Yes I have

Q. How would you describe the interior?

A. Very very clean

Q. You didn't notice any tears in the upholstery or anything like that?

A. No, the seat appeared to be in pretty good shape.

Q. your vehicle, is that correct?

A. Right

Q. Concerning the back seat of that automobile belonging to MR. JAMES and the front seat prior to having the seat cover on, what would you say the condition to be likened to?

A. I would say both the front seat and the back were in excellent condition in excellent condition. I mean I didn't see any major rips or tears or any

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foam rubber popping out between the seats you know it looked in pretty excellent shape.

Q. Did you ever happen to notice whether or not MR. JAMES used a not a cover but there is a like a aired seat to put on top of the seat to drive in comfort. It's like a cushion you put on top of your seat to sit on?

A. As a matter of fact he did have some sort of backing that you would sit on and it also was a back rest. It was a combination seat and back rest. I do remember something similar to that and I do remember seeing him with a blanket or two every now and then.

Q. Why would you take exception to the fact MR. JAMES was gone for approximately two week or two and a half week period of time during last time during the months I've mentioned before?

A. I was unemployed at the time and me living here I would notice everything that goes on here.

Q. You spend most of your time at your apartment?

A. Right cause I was out of work at the time and like I said I don't go out a lot every night you know. I was unemployed at the time and I couldn't afford it and I basically hung around here and watched T.V. and had a few beers and I know exactly what goes on around here.

Q. During the time that MR. JAMES was away, was his vehicle also missing?

A. Yes it was. His car is always parked next to mine and his car was definitely gone.

Q. Now after MR. JAMES arrived back to the Pompano area and back at his residence, is that when he eventually had the seat changed and upholstered in

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his vehicle?

A. I would say roughly a week or two from the time he came back I would say he had a new seat put in his car.

Q. Now you are saying a week or two from the time he came back until he had it upholstered or when he came back was it upholstered?

A. Let me say....let me say this, I might not be exactly right but I'll say he might have had it done pretty close time from when he came back. I think that he had had a new

Q. Within a couple of days probably?

A. Let me narrow it down and say maybe take a rough guess and say within a week, within a week. It was pretty shortly after he came back that he had a new seat.

Q. What brought your attention to this seat that it was changed?

A. I noticed the difference from the front seat to the back seat, I noticed the front seat was a different design and a slightly different shade of color.

Q. Did you ever inquire to MR. JAMES why he had it done?

A. Yes I did

Q. What was his response?

A. He said that the other one was getting old and that he said he was just gonna go ahead and get a new one done.

Q. He was going to get a new one done?

A. That's what he told me that he had had the new seat done.

Q. Did he ever mention to you how much he paid for the seat cover, did you ever inquire?

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A. I believe it was roughly in the neighborhood of \$80. something dollars.

Q. Did he ever mention to you or did you inquire rather where he had the seat cover put on the seat?

A. He mentioned that he had had it done up on Dixie Highway in Pompano. We had talked about having seat covers done on cars and I had mentioned to him that I was going to have a front seat put in my Chevy and that's why I inquired of him how much he had paid for his front seat cause I have a burn mark on my front seat and a couple of coffee stains and I was...at that time I was wondering you know I was curious what the reupholstery job was. That's why I had asked him.

Q. Did you feel that seat, that the original seat warranted repair?

A. No, no I don't, I don't feel that it did need a repair. I feel that the front seat was in pretty good shape.

Q. MR. WINDHURST, in the four years that you have lived in this apartment, you indicated that MR. JAMES has lived in the front apartment #1?

A. Yes

Q. And he's had that same automobile?

A. Yes he has

Q. Where did he normally park that car in the parking lot provided out here?

A. Always next to my car. That was his assigned parking spot.

Q. And he's always next to your car?

A. Yes he has

Q. ~~Would that be in the spot south of your car or north of your car?~~

A. It would but if it rains he would go outside and clean it off as soon as it stopped raining. In other words you never saw his car dirty. You never saw his car dirty, his car was clean every day of the week.

Q. Would you describe him as being very meticulous?

A. Yes he was very meticulous with the car. All the windows in the car are always spotless, the interior was clean, the outside was clean, the tires were always clean, he was a car nut.

A. Every time I saw him come home from work he was pretty clean for being in construction.

Q. Was there many times you seen him come home from work?

A. Yeh there was, yeh there was, many times I would see him get in and out of his car and I would see him come and go from his place.

Q. Would there be times during your tenor of employment some where or when you were out of employment?

A. Yes I did because the people next door told me that he was part owner or owner of a nursery over here in Pompano and also told me that he was a part owner or owner of a laundromat in Pompano too.

Q. Did you ever see MR. JAMES ever have any children over here?

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A. No he didn't want anything, he didn't want to buy anything.

Q. What did he respond to you why he didn't want to buy anything?

A. He said you know that he...at one time he said that he just didn't want to spend the money, he didn't want it.

Q. He didn't want to spend the money?

A. Right

Q. And what time of the year was that, was that around the summer also?

A. No, that was, that was, that was in 1979 when I had offered him the parts for sale.
