General Homicide Information

Victims: 1-Females/ Lucas has stated that he prefers to murder young white females, but has stated that he has killed both young and old. Lucas has also indicated that he has also killed numerous black females as well.

2-Males/ Lucas has killed several males; however, these subjects were not the primary targets. The males were killed through armed robberies or happened to be out on dates when Lucas would pick out a female target. There is a possibility that Lucas has been responsible for some male homo-sexual homicides

Methods of Operation: 1-Stabbings/ Lucas would normally stab victims repeatedly in and around the chest area, and has also been known to cut victim's throats.

2-Mutilations/ Lucas has dissected, decapitated and severely lacerated victims. Lucas has been known to take different body parts with him across state lines on different occasions.

3-Shootings: On different occasions, Lucas has used firearms to kill his victims. Lucas would shoot his victims more than once either in the head, chest, back or abdomen.

4-Strangulations/ Victims of Lucas have been choked to death by various means. Manual strangulation with hands, articles of clothing and pieces of cloth are some of the devices used by Lucas.

5-Beatings/ Lucas has confessed to beating numerous victims to death. Different types of instruments; as well as, manual use of his hands have been used to carry out these homicides.

Weapons Used: Firearms/ 1-Hand guns (revolvers and automatics)
Calibers/ .22, .32, .38, .357

2-Rifles (single-shot, automatics and lever action)
Calibers/ .22, 308, 30-30

3-Shotgun
Gauge/ .410

Knives/ Usually butcher knives or homemade knives that were honed down by Lucas.

girlfriend, BECKY, had lived with KATE RICH for a few days during the spring of 1982. [REDACTED] On September 28, 1982, the vehicle which LUCUS had been driving was found abandoned by the [REDACTED] The car was processed and human blood was detected in the vehicle's interior. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He was questioned about the disappearance of KATE RICH at this time but denied any involvement. [REDACTED]

On June 11, 1983, Reverend RUBEN MOORE reported LUCUS in possession of a firearm to the Montague County Sheriff's Office. LUCUS was subsequently arrested on a weapons violation charge. LUCUS was again questioned concerning the disappearance of KATE RICH and admitted that he had killed her, chopped her up, and burned her in a woodburning stove where he used to live. LUCUS led investigators to his former residence, and the investigators did find human remains in his woodburning stove. LUCUS also admitted that he had killed his girlfriend, BECKY, with a knife and led investigators to her remains near Interstate 35 in Denton, Texas. LUCUS has been charged with First Degree Murder in these two cases.

[REDACTED] He served time in Jackson State Penitentiary, Jackson, Michigan, and [REDACTED] and has been at large since this time. He has traveled about the country living at many locations. Since 1975, LUCUS has claimed to have killed approximately 140 females. [REDACTED]

He will then murder these women, usually by stabbing them to death. He has admitted to strangling some and shooting others. LUCUS stated that he murdered his victims to have sex with them. He prefers to have sexual intercourse with them after they are dead. LUCUS also enjoys sex with various types of animals, usually dogs, and prefers to kill the animals prior to intercourse.

LUCUS has been charged with the murders of five women in Texas, and MAX FIELD, an attorney from Wichita Falls, Texas, has been appointed to represent him.

On Monday evening, June 27, 1983, HENRY LEE LUCUS was interviewed at the Montague County Jail, Montague, Texas, by Deputy Inspector DARREL WILKINS, Agent ROBERT E. LEE, and Detective SCOTT SINGER of the Moore, Oklahoma Police Department. Prior to any questioning LUCUS was verbally apprised of his Constitutional rights afforded him under the Miranda Court decision. LUCUS indicated he fully understood his rights and, with these rights in mind, elected to converse freely with the investigators. LUCUS informed the

investigators that he had been appointed an attorney but did not really want him.

The investigators informed LUCUS that they would be interested in any homicides that he may have perpetrated anywhere within the state of Oklahoma. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He also stated that he had been on the turnpikes in Oklahoma. Very early in the interview, LUCUS was asked to briefly describe the homicides that he had committed in the state of Oklahoma. LUCUS stated that he had committed the following offenses:

1. He strangled a Caucasian female to death near a truck stop on Interstate 40 outside Oklahoma City. He stated that this white female was approximately 19 years old. He stated he had sexual intercourse with her and left her nude. *Leona August*

2. LUCUS claims he sexually assaulted and stabbed a white female, approximately 30 years of age, to death somewhere south of Oklahoma City on Interstate 35 and left her lying nude. *Virginia*

3. LUCUS stated that somewhere between Oklahoma City and the Texas line he shot a female to death and left her lying nude.

4. LUCUS claims that in Oklahoma City approximately three-quarters of a mile past the interchange of I-35 and I-40, he left a Mexican girl with long black hair stabbed to death about 40 feet from the road. *Virginia*

5. In March or April of 1970, while LUCUS was on parole for a short period from Jackson State Penitentiary, he was in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and killed a female on Pennsylvania Avenue approximately five blocks down from a mission.

6. LUCUS claims that he was traveling with a couple known as the SMITHS and stopped at a bar somewhere near Ft. Smith, Arkansas. He claims to have picked up a female in the bar and took her out to the side of the road and killed her. He took this girl from the bar while the SMITHS stayed behind. The SMITHS, DEBBIE and BILL, were traveling companions from Poplar Bluff, Missouri, and all of them had been coming from Pasadena, California. This girl he claims he killed from the bar was redheaded, skinny, wore glasses, and was well dressed in a lady's suit with a jacket and was wearing high-heeled shoes. He believes this would have been in October of 1982 when this occurred. He recalls that he left her body up on top of a bank off the side of a road in a wooded area. *Virginia*

LUCUS informed the investigators that he thought that he had killed 140 women and girls. He claims that his victims have been anywhere from 9 years of age up to 80 years of age. He stated he has no preference as to race, and some of his victims have been

white, some black, some Indian, some Hispanic, and some Asian. He stated that the reason he killed all of these women was for sex. He

[REDACTED] He admitted that he derives more satisfaction from having sex with a dead person. He stated that he has never killed a male and would have no reason to do so. [REDACTED]

LUCUS was born and raised in the state of West Virginia. He has spent twenty-three years total in prison. He was imprisoned at the Richmond State Penitentiary, Richmond, Virginia, and at a vocational school in Beaumont, Virginia. He was also incarcerated at the Chillicothe, Ohio Federal Reformatory and at the Jackson State Penitentiary in Jackson, Michigan. He spent six years in the Iona State Hospital in Michigan, which is a mental institution. He was incarcerated in the Jackson State Penitentiary for murdering his mother and was released in 1975.

LUCUS stated that he began having sexual relations with animals at a young age and later began killing them prior to having sex with them. He killed his first human being when he was fifteen years old and discovered that he enjoyed sex more after they were dead. He believes that he has left bodies in 20 to 25 states. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He will usually leave his victims lying nude and take their clothing and purse. He throws the clothing and purse away at another location. He does not rob or steal from his victims. LUCUS has raped a few of his victims and did not kill them. He did not understand why he did not kill these particular victims. These rapes have occurred in various states.

LUCUS travels by hitchhiking or driving cars, usually older models. He usually buys an old car, steals an old car, or sometimes will drive the victim's car. LUCUS has been living at the House of Prayer in Stoneburg, Texas since approximately May of 1982. He has held various jobs during his travels and has been a roofer, auto mechanic, construction worker, and has worked in electronics.

LUCUS recalled a rape which he had committed in Oklahoma where he did not kill the victim. During the summer of 1981 he was in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma at a location near Interstate 40 close to the main part of town. He was driving a 1966 red Ford with a cream-colored fender and was in an area consisting of houses and churches. LUCUS saw a young female walking down the street, stopped and drug her in his car, and raped her in his car. He did not threaten her with either a gun or knife, and after raping her left her at that same location. He did not rape her orally or anally. He described her as being a white female, about 16 years old, blond hair, 5'3", 110 to 115 lbs., well built, wearing blue jeans and a blue blouse.

LUCUS recalls an occasion which he first believed was in September of 1982 when he picked up a girl in Altus, Oklahoma and took her to the other side of Amarillo, Texas and stabbed her to death. At this time LUCUS was working on the roofing crew of Reverend RUBEN MOORE and was staying at the Friendship Motel in Altus. In fact, he stole a television set from the room at this motel. He was driving north of Altus on Highway 283 when he observed a girl walking alongside this highway carrying a purse. He described her as being a white female, 23 or 24 years old, 5', 140 lbs., blonde hair, generally described as short and chubby. She voluntarily got in the car with him and they were traveling to California. LUCUS was driving a blue 1966 Ford. They drove to an RV park approximately fifteen miles west of Amarillo on Interstate 40, called either the AA or the AAA. He believes that this girl's first name was [redacted]. This RV park which they stopped at was on the service road just off of Interstate 40. The car they were riding in became heated, and he pulled off the interstate first thinking the RV park may have been a service station. He got a quart of oil from a blonde-haired woman working at the RV park and put it in his car. He stayed at the RV park all day working on his car and got a jump start from someone who had a large recreational vehicle. However, the car was still not running correctly. He rented a space for his car at the RV park for approximately seven dollars (\$7.00) and both he and she slept in the car. He believes that the owners of the RV park would remember them.

The next day he walked approximately one-half mile to a store near some grain elevators. He recalls that this store had something to do with the "Waltons". At the store he met a crippled guy on metal crutches in his 30's who was driving a Plymouth Satellite. This guy seemed to be a friend of the store owner. He lived at some church around the store. LUCUS gave this man on crutches the colored television set he had taken from the motel room in Altus, and in return this man agreed to drive him into Amarillo. This man drove him into Amarillo to an auto parts store on Amarillo Street, which LUCUS believes to be the same as Business 40. He purchased an oil pump at this store and returned to put it on his car but discovered that a shaft in the pump was broken and had to go back into town to have this replaced. The girl who was traveling with him stayed in the car during this period of time while he worked on the car.

After they repaired the car they left westbound on Interstate 40 towards California. Approximately twelve to thirteen miles west of the RV park was a small circle-type turnoff road. As he was driving his car and just before he reached the turnoff, he began stabbing his female passenger with a butcher knife. He believed he stabbed her once through the breast. He stopped at this circle drive and had sex with her. He then drug her nude body about 50 feet from this circle drive off the interstate and left her in the grass. The date this happened would have been sometime after September 16, 1982. September 16 was the day that he killed KATE RICH in Stoneburg, Texas.

LUCUS took the lady's clothes, which he described as being light blue slacks, a white blouse, a blue windbreaker, and ladies' high boots with him and discarded them in a roadside park a distance west of where he had left her body. He later abandoned his car in Needles, California and learned that the police impounded it and found blood in the vehicle. He left it in Needles because it broke down on him again. This vehicle had a Texas registration and was registered to LUCUS.

LUCUS recalled another homicide he had done but is not certain where it occurred. He believes it possibly may have been in Oklahoma somewhere in a small town between Oklahoma City and Duncan, or at least somewhere southwest of Oklahoma City. On this occasion he observed a white female in a two-story white frame house with a detached garage to one side. There was a concrete driveway leading to the house, and he entered this residence at the third window on the side facing the garage. He entered in the dining room area of the house and strangled this lady with a piece of phone wire which he carried on a roll in his car. This homicide would have been sometime after August 1982. This lady was 40 years of age or older and had grayish-black hair. He raped her in the living room and then put her in the bathtub and filled it half-full of water. She was dead when he put her in the bathtub, and all of her clothes would have been left in the living room. He would have left the phone wire around her neck in knots. LUCUS then said this house may have been located in a suburb of Oklahoma City. He thinks this was just before he murdered KATE RICH and his girlfriend, BECKY. He murdered RICH on September 16, 1982 and BECKY on August 23, 1982.

In 1980 and 1981, LUCUS was living in Jacksonville, Florida and met BECKY POWELL. He lived with BECKY and her grandmother, SARAH LORRAINE HARLEY until she died in May 1981. He never came to the state of Oklahoma during this period of time he resided in Jacksonville, Florida. LUCUS lived and traveled with BECKY for approximately four years and committed numerous murders of women during this time; however, BECKY was not aware of what he was doing.

Although he has traveled in Oklahoma, he does not have any relatives or acquaintances living in this state. He has never stayed for any extended period in Oklahoma. He was asked if he frequented any bars or stayed in any particular motels in this state, and he said that he did not.

LUCUS informed that most of his bodies were left nude lying near or along major highways. On occasion he has dragged brush or other articles over the body and sometimes has left them lying in culverts. On other occasions he has burned their bodies or threw them in lakes. On one occasion he recalls putting a body in a junk, vacant school bus. In an area of North Carolina he buried several of his victims in fresh graves at a cemetery. He would find a grave in which a body had just been buried and dig down a few feet to bury his victim over the person in the grave. He admitted to cutting the heads off of several of his victims with a butcher knife, and with other victims he cut them into pieces.

While LUCUS was on parole in 1970 for approximately eight months from Jackson State Penitentiary in Michigan, he believes that he picked up a female along the turnpike near Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He shot her with a .38 caliber pistol which he believed was a Smith & Wesson with a pearl handle. He had stolen this gun in Florida from BECKY'S uncle, named HOWARD TOLE, who lived in the Jacksonville, Florida area. LUCUS then changed his mind and said that possibly he could have killed this girl in 1980. He pawned this pistol at a pawn shop on a corner in New Orleans near a park just off of Interstate 10. This park would have been in the middle of the city.

This girl he had murdered was hitchhiking and he picked her up at an off-ramp. He had sex with her but received no satisfaction, so he shot her in the chest and neck and then had sex with her after she died. She had been carrying a shoulder bag and two suitcases. He shot her off on a side road somewhere further down the road in Oklahoma toward Texas. Her clothing and luggage were thrown off a bridge on the right side somewhere near Shreveport, Louisiana. LUCUS stated he was driving a 1961 red and white Chevrolet Impala two-door when this happened and later sold the car at a junkyard in northeastern Maryland.

At this point there was a thirty minute break in the questioning of LUCUS. When the questioning resumed, the investigators again asked LUCUS to go over all of the homicides he had committed in Oklahoma. At this point LUCUS gave the following accounts:

1) In 1970 while LUCUS was on parole from Jackson State Penitentiary in Michigan, he picked up a Mexican or Caucasian female, black hair, approximately 25 years of age, somewhere in Oklahoma. He believes this would have been sometime in March or May of 1970. He was traveling from Little Rock to Oklahoma City when he picked up this girl. Both of them stopped and ate at a truck stop and then they went south on Interstate 35. They then took a highway that continued south but was not an interstate. As they were in the front seat of his car, he shot her with a .38 caliber lead bullet. He left her body nude somewhere off the roadway near a ditch and field. This would have been off a two-lane highway and about ten to fifteen feet off the pavement. He left her lying with her knees up on her back with her legs spread. He did not leave any of her clothing or purse around her. She had been dressed in blue denim slacks, a belt, a white blouse, and cloth-type shoes similar to tennis shoes. She had been wearing beige panties and a beige bra. He threw her clothes out at a bridge approximately fifteen miles from where her body was. He believes that he shot this girl in his car once in the side of the neck and then two or three times in the chest. This was an old .38 pistol that he used. He later gave this pistol to his halfbrother, HARRY WALL, who lives outside Stanton, Virginia. WALL is a white male who would now be in his fifties and who at that time worked on a dairy farm. LUCUS was driving a 1961 white over red Chevrolet at this time and left the car in Virginia at a sawmill between Blacksburg and Christianburg. It was a stolen car with Ohio tags. He had just gotten out of prison in Michigan on parole and

had stolen this car. He believes that the highway near the sawmill where he left this car was Highway 460.

2. During the summer of 1979, probably in June or July, LUCUS was visiting in Hurst, Texas. He picked up a white female in either the Denton or Dallas, Texas area. He took her to a location on Interstate 35 about twenty minutes from Oklahoma City and strangled her with his hands. She was a middle-aged woman with brown hair dressed in Levi's and a blue shirt. He believes that he left her in a field off a farm road about three miles from the truck stop south of Oklahoma City on Interstate 35. He believes this location would have been about three miles due east of this truck stop. He left this victim lying at the edge of a field along a white fence. He had killed her on a road in front of the restaurant at the truck stop. He took her clothing and discarded the items along Interstate 35 somewhere in Texas.

3. During the fall of 1977, probably in October, he was coming from Illinois when he picked up a female hitchhiker on the other side of Little Rock, Arkansas. She was a young white female, 18 to 20 years of age, and her first name was possibly LUCUS believes that this female was a brunette. He strangled her with a white wire and left her somewhere around Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, probably within the city limits. It would have been somewhere off of Interstate 40, and he believes that he redressed her and left her other belongings around the body. This location also may have been somewhere just to the south of Oklahoma City.

4. Sometime in the fall of 1977 he picked up a female at an off-ramp of Interstate 40 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, stabbed her to death, and threw her over an embankment on Interstate 20 east of Dallas, Texas. He described her as being a young, blonde female. He threw her clothing off a bridge at Shreveport, Louisiana.

5. In late September 1982, LUCUS was traveling from Amarillo, Texas with the SMITHS, who he had met in Albuquerque, New Mexico. They stopped at a restaurant located on top of a hill on Interstate 40 about two hours from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. They were driving a 1960 Rambler Classic station wagon. He picked up a girl at this restaurant and they all left together toward Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He described her as having long dark brown or black hair, being 17 or 18 years of age, being 5'2" to 5'3" in height, and wearing a blue pants suit with a jacket and a blouse. She was wearing ladies' boots. They stopped at a truck stop on the left side of Interstate 40 just outside Oklahoma City, Oklahoma where LUCUS stabbed this female three times, once in the breast, and then twice in the center of her chest. He left her approximately three or four hundred feet from this truck stop and left her clothing around the body. This truck stop would have been a large truck stop on Interstate 40 on the edge of Oklahoma City as you drive into Oklahoma City from Amarillo. The SMITHS were with him at this time but were not aware of what he had done to the girl. He believes they were inside the truck stop when it happened.

6. In October of 1982, LUCUS and the SMITHS were drinking at a beer tavern in Ft. Smith, Arkansas. LUCUS left with a girl he had met in the bar and was gone from the bar approximately one-half hour. He strangled this girl with a wire and left the wire around her neck. He obtained the wire out of SMITH'S car, the Rambler Classic station wagon. He left her on an embankment near a roadway. He then returned back to the bar and he and the SMITHS traveled to Sylvia, Missouri and then on to Illinois and Indiana. LUCUS then came back to Stoneburg, Texas.

LUCUS claims to have picked up a young female in May of 1983 at a truck stop in Terral, Oklahoma. He described her as being a white female, black hair, very pretty, weighing no more than 110 pounds with a nice build. She was wearing tight blue jeans and a white blouse. She told him that she was 16 years old. She may have been named JAN. She was walking on the highway near the truck stop in Terral, Oklahoma without any luggage and voluntarily went with LUCUS. LUCUS was driving a white over maroon 1973 Pontiac Catalina. He had just bought this car in Stoneburg, Texas in May of 1983. LUCUS then stabbed this young girl twice in the chest area while she was still in his car. He left her body in a grassy, wooded area close to a highway. He said that she would be about fifteen feet from the roadway. He said that he left her near a little town with grain elevators just outside Altus, Oklahoma. He then stated that he may have left her on Highway 283 somewhere between the Red River Bridge south of Altus and Altus, Oklahoma. He left her clothing and her small handbag around a roadside park near Deming, New Mexico. He may have left some of the clothing in his car. The car he left at a truck stop in San Juan, New Mexico after the engine went out. He believes that the sheriff in San Juan, New Mexico has his car. LUCUS believes he would have left some "angel dust" in the car.

After he left this girl's body near Altus in May of 1983, he picked up the other girl hitchhiking north of Altus on Highway 283 and took her to Amarillo, Texas where he murdered her (LUCUS had talked about this second girl earlier in his conversations and said that it had occurred in September 1982).

LUCUS informs that the reason he is helping police agencies with their homicides is that he recognizes that he is dangerous and should not be out on the street. He says he just wants to help others now. Attached with this report will be the following documents:

1. An information sheet on HENRY LEE LUCUS compiled by the Montague County Sheriff's Office which includes an itinerary of his travels from 1981 through 1983, and copies of his photograph and fingerprints.
2. A handwritten itinerary of LUCUS'S travels compiled by the Montague County Sheriff's Office covering the period from August 22, 1975 through June 1983.

3. A teletype to the OSBI from the Texas Ranger concerning a homicide near Highway 69 in Oklahoma which LUCUS claims he committed.
4. Four (4) Polaroid photographs of HENRY LEE LUCUS taken by Deputy Inspector DARREL WILKINS.

AGENT'S NOTE: HENRY LEE LUCUS was very vague in his descriptions of homicides he claims he committed in the state of Oklahoma. LUCUS could not provide enough details of these homicides to convince the interviewing officers that he was the responsible party. LUCUS was inconsistent in his accounts of homicides he believes he committed in Oklahoma and contradicted himself several times during the interview. The information provided by LUCUS did not correspond very well with any known homicides in Oklahoma, nor could he provide enough details and directions where investigators could locate a body. LUCUS appeared over eager to help the investigating officers, and it is believed that he would probably say what he thought the officers wanted to hear. Throughout the interview LUCUS wanted the interviewing officers to tell him about their unsolved homicides, then LUCUS would tell the officers whether he did that particular homicide or did not commit that crime. Based upon the interview with HENRY LEE LUCUS, it is this agent's opinion that LUCUS did not commit 140 homicides as he claims. It is quite probable that he has committed others somewhere and at some point in time; however, LUCUS cannot provide sufficient details and information which would link him with any homicides in Oklahoma at this time. Any information provided by LUCUS should be independently verified by investigators before any reliance is placed upon LUCUS' statements. Anyone interviewing LUCUS in the future should be cautious not to give LUCUS any details of the crime he is being questioned about. It is believed that LUCUS will use any information given to him to try to convince officers that he committed that crime.

Texas Ranger PHIL RYAN was contacted telephonically by Deputy Inspector DARREL WILKINS. RYAN, who has dealt with LUCUS since his arrest, is also quite skeptical of LUCUS' claim to have killed up to 140 women. RYAN is convinced that LUCUS did commit the homicide of KATE RICH and the homicide of his girlfriend; however, RYAN is skeptical of some of the other confessions which LUCUS has given to various law enforcement officers in Texas. To test LUCUS' reliability, Texas Ranger PHIL RYAN deliberately made up a homicide which did not actually happen and questioned LUCUS about these crimes. LUCUS confessed to these fabricated homicides. RYAN does feel that it is possible that LUCUS has committed other homicides, but at this point in time he has not convinced RYAN that he has. RYAN stated that LUCUS likes to "play games" with interrogating officers. RYAN stated he has received inquiries from law enforcement agencies in numerous states concerning LUCUS, but none of these agencies have been able to verify any of the homicides in their jurisdictions which LUCUS has confessed to.

At the time LUCUS was interviewed by OSBI agents, he had been undergoing questioning by Texas authorities, as well as officers from out of state. Consideration should be given to scheduling a second interview with LUCUS sometime in the future after he has had time to reflect upon homicides he has committed. The constant questioning of LUCUS during this period may account for some of LUCUS' vagueness and confusion.

Additional Details of Offense, Progress of Investigation, etc.

On 8-17-82 a phone call was received from two investigators in Mississippi who requested they be notified if this case is cleared as they have similar cases which occurred in their area in 1980. The Officers' are (1) T. P. On August 7, 1982, Agent DENNIS SMITH was telephonically contacted by the Sheriff's Office in ~~Sayre~~, Oklahoma, at approximately 1130 hours advising him that the body of a nude female had been discovered underneath the north fork of the Red River bridge on I-40 which is located one mile southeast of ~~Sayre~~, Oklahoma. The dispatcher advised SMITH that it appeared that it was a homicide and that Sheriff DEAN SMITH of the Beckham County Sheriff's Office was requesting OSBI assistance in the investigation of the case.

Agent SMITH proceeded to the previously mentioned location which is more accurately described as 9/10 of a mile northeast of the 22 mile marker on I-40 which is almost in the middle of the above mentioned bridge. The victim, a white female, was completely nude and was lying directly off the edge of the bridge in the river face up. The female victim appeared to be in her early twenties. Her feet were bound together just above the left ankle with gray duct tape. There was a scrape on the outside of her left leg. She also had gray duct tape wrapped all around her head completely covering her mouth, nose, and eyes. The tape ran from the top of her eyebrows to bottom of her chin. The victim had duct tape on her left wrist and had marks on her right wrist to indicate that her wrists had been bound together at one time. It is thought possibly that one of the wrists came apart after the fall from the bridge. There was also visible evidence of possible strangulation marks about the neck and a line which indicated a ligature strangulation.

Rigor mortis was not complete at 1420 hours on August 7, 1982. Her left foot was located approximately 15 feet north of an east bridge pier and she was located in approximately 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 inches of water. The water temperature at the time the crime scene was conducted was approximately 75 degrees. The day was partly cloudy, humid, with temperatures 85 to 90 degrees. Agent SMITH took pictures first from the top of the bridge and then went down to the river bottom and took close up pictures of the victim. One visible point of identification which was quite obvious was a rose tattoo which was located directly above her left breast on her chest. The tattoo was of a rose with a stem going toward her

heart made in () and at the end of the () was a little bitty
rose bud. The victim appeared to have purple eye shadow on her
top eyelids, however, this was not an accurate description due to
the fact the victim had been lying outside for several hours.
There were no other signs of injury to the victim and no visible
gunshot wounds or knife wounds.

On August 12, 1982, Agent DEAN SMITH released a nation wide broadcast special attention stations along I-40 for law enforcement only do not broadcast. The teletype read as such:

"On 8/7/82, the body of a nude white female was found underneath the north fork Red River Bridge in the east bound lane of Interstate 40. The victim was bound hand and foot with gray duct tape and her face from the top of her eyebrows to the bottom of her chin was also wrapped in gray duct tape. The victim had marks of ligature strangulation around the neck. Official cause of death has been listed as affixia and ligature strangulation. The victim has been ID as a MARYLYN THERESA THERIAULT, Age 22. THERIAULT allegedly was engaging truckdrivers in acts of prostitution at a local truckstop in Amarillo, Texas. She disappeared on 8/6/82 at approximately 2230 hours. Any department who is working a similar case or believes to have information concerning this case, please contact the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation or the Beckham County Sheriff's Office, or the Special Crimes Unit of the Amarillo Police Department."

Agent SMITH requested this teletype be released periodically over the next week and received the following responses.

On August 16, 1982, Agent SMITH was contacted by Deputy COLLEN INGELS of the Grant Parish Sheriff's Office in Grant Parish County, Louisiana, Telephone #318/627-3261. Deputy INGELS stated that the victim of the case she was investigating had both hands completely wrapped in duct tape. She stated that there was 25 feet of duct tape wrapped around the victim's legs, 21.4 feet of duct tape wrapped around the head, and approximately 14 feet wrapped around the hands of the victim. The victim was found in September of 1980 in a gravel pit which had filled with water. The victim was a local from the area and was known to hitchhike a lot. She had last been seen in a bar near the area which she had been found. Deputy INGELS stated that the victim was 18 years old

and worked at the Pit Grill in the county in which she was found. Dep. INGELS stated that they have two suspects a DAN A. NOBLES, whose address was 1109 G. Tanglewood in Westwego Louisiana, DOB: 3/13/53, SSN: and a MICHAEL MCGINNY, Farmer address 1723 Dublin Street, New Orleans, Louisiana. He had a Louisiana driver's license #3629443, SSN: and DOB: 12/28/53. Deputy INGELS stated that she believed that the victim did fool around with the C.B. radio a lot and that a passerby had heard her apparently trying to talk to someone about meeting them some place early in the morning the day before the victim was found. Deputy INGELS also stated that pieces of straw were found in the victim's tape. Deputy INGELS invited Agent SMITH to consult back if he came up with any evidence in the case.

Agent SMITH also received information from Sergeant Detective DON PENNINGTON of the Oklahoma City Police Department concerning the two females that had been abducted from the state fair of Oklahoma in September of 1981. PENNINGTON stated that their suspect which they have a description on had purchased two rolls of duct tape from a TG&Y convenience store prior to disappearing with the two young females. PENNINGTON also advised Agent SMITH that he heard of a female victim being found north of Las Cruces, New Mexico, taped with duct tape, however, PENNINGTON did not have the details of the information concerning this case. Agent SMITH later learned from Sheriff DEAN SMITH that he had received information concerning the female victim from the Las Cruces Police Department. However, the information they had given had not been very explicit and they had no leads in the case they were working and it was an old case.

Agent SMITH also received information from a Detective STAN REED of the Sacramento California Sheriff's Department, Telephone #916/440-5057, homicide detail. Detective REED gave Agent SMITH the following information concerning a homicide that had occurred on December 20, 1980, in which two young people, an 18 year old male and 18 year old female had been kidnapped in an adjoining county and their bodies had been dumped in Sacramento County and they were discovered in a remote lover's lane area. Both of the victims had been bound and gagged with silver duct tape. The female's face including her nose and mouth was completely covered. There were signs of sexual conduct against the female. Both victims also had five superficial knife wounds on their necks and then both victims had a six knife wound to the neck which was very severe and resulted in their death. The female victim had signs of affixia as a result of the tape on her mouth and nose. A number of suspects had been investigated in the case, however, no good suspects had been developed. Detective REED concluded by stating that the victims had been abducted close to an interstate freeway and the lover's lane area that they were found in was also very close to an interstate freeway system near Sacramento. Detective STAN REED also invited Agent SMITH if he came up with any suspects or possible MO's to feel free to contact him for reference

of any evidence regarding a connection of the two cases.

On August 17, 1982, Agent DENNIS SMITH was contacted by T.P. NAILER of the Mississippi State Police, Telephone #601/864-2186 or 601/863-7611. MR. NAILER stated that they had two bodies just off the interstate system in Mississippi, but the hands and feet had been tied with plastic bags and the victims had been strangled. T.P. NAILER who is stationed at Gulf Port, Mississippi stated that if anything that would be relevant or similar to the investigations, to feel free to contact him also at #601/864-1314 or to contact Deputy ED LITTLE of the Harrison County Criminal Investigations Section at #601/863-7611. MR. NAILER stated that both of these bodies had been found in 1980 and no new leads have been developed since that time.

On August 16, 1982, Agent SMITH visited with a Detective JOHN PETERSON of the Clackamas County Sheriff's Department from Clackamas County Oregon, Telephone #503/655-8218. PETERSON stated that approximately 15 to 16 months earlier, a male victim had been discovered on I-5. His face had not been covered, however, his arms and legs were bound with duct tape. Detective PETERSON stated he believed the victim was possibly thrown off of a bridge directly off of I-5. the victim had fallen into a river and floated down stream and the investigating officers were not completely sure of where the victim was originally thrown into the water. Detective PETERSON stated that the case is actually being investigated by a Deputy LINDA ESTES who is currently on vacation. Any further correspondence concerning this case should be done through her.

Also on August 17, 1982, Agent SMITH received information from a Sergeant JACK JUDD of Coconino County Sheriff's Office out of Flagstaff, Arizona. Sergeant JUDD, Telephone #602/774-4523, stated that he had an unidentified female body that was found February 14, 1982, along a freeway. He stated that when they found the body, the victim was almost completely decomposed and that no fingerprint or facial features could be discovered. JUDD stated that he had a composite of a truck driver who was thought to have been seen with the girl last circulating through and would send a copy of the circulator to the OSBI in Oklahoma. Agent SMITH also sent a flyer on the female victim to Sergeant JUDD at P.O. Box 39, Flagstaff, Arizona, 86002. JUDD stated that the female victim appeared to be a hitchhiking type female that was traveling up and down the interstate. She was found with her blue jeans still on her body, however, her upper clothing had been removed and was found a distance from where the body was lying. Sergeant JUDD stated that any additional information that could be shared would be appreciated.

On August 17, 1982, Agent SMITH also talked with Detective MARY FISH of the New Haven Connecticut Police Department. Detective FISH, Telephone #203/787-6004, called basically for the reason that she had a 55 years old male victim that had been

strangled and had been bound up with sheets in a motel frequented by prostitutes in the New Haven, Connecticut area. The main reason MS FISH called was because the name of the victim was THERIAULT and the victim originated from Nashua, New Hampshire, the same hometown as the female victim in this case. MS FISH stated that she would continue to do some background investigation and if there appeared to be a connection in anyway, she would recontact Agent SMITH. Agent SMITH did advise her that THERIAULT was a married name for MARY THERIAULT and that she had been divorced from her husband well over a year and apparently had not had much contact with him. MS FISH theorized that possibly this THERIAULT could be the father of the female victim's ex-husband, however, she stated that she did not know that for certain at that time.

On August 25, 1982, Agent DENNIS SMITH received the following information from FBI Agent DICK FELTER who is stationed out of Gallop, New Mexico, Telephone #505/325-8631. Agent FELTER stated that on Saturday, August 14th, a 13 year old Indian girl was abducted and taken out to the country where she was brutally raped, taped up, and stabbed. However, the young female had not been killed and managed to walk to an adjoining farmhouse where she was able to get help and is alive at this time. Agent FELTER stated that he has gotten a composite of a man and a woman who was described as being involved in the abduction of the 13 year old girl. Detective FELTER stated that the suspects, in their late forties to early fifties, were driving an older grayish blue full size station wagon. The female was described as having salt and pepper hair, short sleeve short, slacks, and was wearing glasses. The male was a white male in his early fifties, skinny, redish brown hair with a receding hair line and black thick lens glasses. He was also wearing low cut tennis shoes, red in color. He had a round face watch and drank Slitch beer. The victim stated that she had been bound up by silver tape at one time, however, when she was found, she had no tape on her. However, there were marks where she had obviously been bound with some type of items. The instrument used to stab her was a plastic handled instrument with approximately a 3" metal that stuck out from the handle, possibly some type of screwdriver or mechanical device. The abduction rape and attempted homicide occurred right off of a major highway 666 between Gallop, New Mexico, and Shiprock, New Mexico. Agent FELTER stated that composites and information concerning the attempted homicide were being sent out to all area agencies through their regional offices and that he would make sure that the OSBI received copies of this information. Detective FELTER stated if they could be of any assistance or if there was a possibility of suspects being developed, that he would appreciate a return call to compare notes.

On August 17, 1982, Agent DENNIS SMITH received a call from Investigator DALE SWAZY of the Arkansas State Police. SWAZY, Telephone #501/224-3393, stated that on September 10,

1979, a black prostitute was working truckstops and rest stops was found off of the I-30 bridge. She was not taped up or tied up in anyway, however, she was found naked and had been strangled by ligiture means. He stated he had found one long brown Caucasian hair, however, that was the only trace evidence he had been able to recover from the scene. He also stated that the victim had been hit several times in the mouth. Investigator SWAZY stated that he would appreciate sharing any information specifically if a light brown Caucasian hair was found among the evidence collected on the female victim involved in this case. Possibly a comparison could be made to see if officers were working toward the same suspect.

VICTIM: MARY THERESA THERIAULT

On August 19, 1982, at 1655 hours, Investigator JACK FUEGLEIN, L.A. County Sheriff's Office, California, Telephone #213/974-4493, telephoned WRO to provide the following information in response to teletype message of request from Agent DENNIS SMITH.

In 1975, a white prostitute was murdered in Gueglein's county by a trucker by the name of JOHNNY ANDERSIN, WM, DOB: 8/1/40, 6'2", 235 lbs., aka/JAMES LEE COOK, FBI #424742L1. ANDERSIN/COOK served one year for the crime and is allegedly back driving a truck. At the time he perpetrated the murder, he was an independent trucker driving a 1970 IHC with a Florida tag #75-10TE312, and his address was 211 West Temple, Los Angeles, California, Room 832. His step-father is a JAMES BUTCHER, Telephone #615/822-1794. ANDERSIN was described as an over-bearing, arrogant, unremorseful son-of-a-bitch who would kill again.

Victim: Freeman, Virginia W/F 090641 5'2" 100 lbs age 40 at death
Date of murder 120181 about 4:00 pm dry clear cool day

Synopsis:

Our investigation has shown that the victim, Virginia Freeman, a real estate sales person received a phone call from an unknown W/M sounding voice with a "good ole boy" Texas drawl stating that he had sold a home in Plainview, Texas, and had \$72,000 cash to invest in land and a house in Brazos County. Against company policy the victim made plans to meet the subject in a secluded area of the county without the subject first coming to her office. The victim then discovered that the house she was to show had been sold but she told co-workers that she had to meet the subject anyway as she had no call back number for him. The victim had no keys to the house and judging by where she parked her car and footprints at the scene she arrived after the subject. The footprints indicate that she was at the house only a few minutes and had walked down the front of the house looking in the windows with the subject when she was struck from behind with a large rock left at the scene. She was then dragged down the side of the house to the rear of the house while being partially disrobed. At the rear of the house she was strangled, stabbed 11 times in the neck area only and struck again with the rock. All stab wounds were to the front of the neck and appear to have been made with a small blade knife by a right handed individual. She was left with her panties and pantyhose removed and her skirt, blouse and jacket pushed up to just beneath her breasts. We donot believe rape occurred as there was no injury to the vagina area and pubic combings were negative. The victim was reported missing by her husband and was found about two hours after the murder.

The attached composite was of a subject seen near this area at about the right time but was not actually seen at the scene. The composite was obtained by hypnosis of a brick laying crew that drove by the area on the way to a jobsite.
