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Det. Hoffman: Okay now regarding July 24, 1981 a transaction that you conducted for an individual that wanted to go from Newport News, Virginia, to Jacksonville, Florida, do you recall that transaction?

Mrs. Chandler: Yes.

Det. Hoffman: Can you basically tell me that occurred on that day?

Mrs. Chandler: Oh I was thinking about this the other day and I thought I know that name. When I was talking to Mrs. Zurak from the Salvation Army, the best I can remember is the man came in and wanted a ticket to Florida and he said that he had a job if he could get there and that he had been, I'm trying it seems like he told me he had been in New Jersey or somewhere with relatives but he wanted to go back to Florida I'm not positive about that...

Det. Hoffman: Okay that's alright.

Mrs. Chandler: But I think so and that he wanted to go back to Florida and he had this job if he could get there and I talked to Captain Jones about it and he had me to call the place that he had said he would have the job and...

Det. Hoffman: So you attempted to verify his employment?

Mrs. Chandler: Right. The best I can remember it was a tile company, I'm not, or electrical or something like, I can't remember.

Det. Hoffman: Was it possibly a roofing company?

Mrs. Chandler: Do you have a name for it, Rose or something?

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Det. Hoffman: No I don't I'll have to check.

Mrs. Chandler: I don't, I can't, it would be on my file if they can find it at the Salvation Army, it would be written down who I had called.

Det. Hoffman: Okay.

Mrs. Chandler: And I did tell Miss Zurak if she could find the telephone bills that they would have the number that I called...ah and talked to the man there and he said that ah this man had worked for him, Mr. Toole had worked for him and ahm but that he would work and then he would just disappear, that he had had some problems with ah a parent dying and something I don't know and after that he had sorta gone hay wire, ^{he would} work a little bit, be gone and work and be gone but that he would give him a job if he came back.

Det. Hoffman: Okay.

Mrs. Chandler: And so we did issue a bus ticket and...

Det. Hoffman: What were the hours you worked on that particular day?

Mrs. Chandler: We were working from, I probably was working 8:30 to 4:30.

Det. Hoffman: 8:30 to 4:30? Do you recall what time of the day he would have come into your office?

Mrs. Chandler: It seems that maybe he came like eleven or eleven-thirty and when I tried to call the man in Florida he was out.

Det. Hoffman: Okay.

MRS. Chandler: For lunch or something so we had him come back that afternoon

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to, after we could verify it. I believe that's the way it was, with so many it's hard to remember exactly.

Det. Hoffman: Okay did you also contact the Greyhound bus people to verify if he could get a bus out to Florida?

Mrs. Chandler: Ah, we, I did call. I don't remember what they told me though, but we did call to check to see you know the times for the bus.

Det. Hoffman: Okay so your next step would, you would write out a check for the fare?

Mrs. Chandler: Yes made to the Greyhound Bus Lines and it would be for a non-refundable ticket.

Det. Hoffman: Non-refundable?

Mrs. Chandler: Right.

Det. Hoffman: And then you would give him the check to take to Greyhound?

Mrs. Chandler: Yes, right. We would call them and tell them that we were sending this man with the check for such a such an amount for a ticket to Jacksonville, Florida, and to let them know that it was a legitimate check.

Det. Hoffman: Okay.

Mrs. Chandler: And Captain Jones and ah, I can't remember probably Brenda Owens signed the check, Captain Jones, I'm not positive.

Det. Hoffman: Now if you wrote a check out on the 24th okay, I mean that would be the day of the transaction, it wouldn't have been if he came in on the 23rd you would have documented it on the

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next days records.

Mrs. Chandler: It would have been documented the day that he came in.

Det. Hoffman: Okay fine so it's definitely the 24th then. Okay now, would you people, the Salvation Army take him to the Greyhound Bus terminal.

Mrs. Chandler: No.

Det. Hoffman: How far was the Greyhound Bus terminal from the Salvation Army?

Mrs. Chandler: Ah probably about maybe two miles, I'm not sure but it's on the same street, on the same side of the street it's just a straight walk down. I don't know if it's two miles, I'm not good at spaces you know.

Det. Hoffman: I see, I see.

Mrs. Chandler: But it's not that far, not very far. We had a lot of people that walked it.

Det. Hoffman: Okay now what happens if Mr. TOOLE failed to get on that bus? What would happen to the check?

Mrs. Chandler: We would get the check back. I mean we, if he cashed it in they just went ahead and, you know if he never used the ticket we wouldn't have any way of knowing whether or not he used it unless he brought it back to us.

Det. Hoffman: So he's not given a check persay, he's given like a pass to get onto this bus?

Mrs. Chandler: No it's a check. He got a check that was...

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Det. Hoffman: Made out to Greyhound.

Mrs. Chandler: ...to Greyhound so we got it back from the bank when he cashes it, you know when he pays for the ticket.

Det. Hoffman: Okay, otherwise it couldn't have been cashed anywhere else.

Mrs. Chandler: Okay fine I see that.

Det. Hoffman: Do you recall what this Mr. Toole looked like, a description of this individual?

Mrs. Chandler: I saw his picture in the paper the other day.

Det. Hoffman: Yeah.

Mrs. Chandler: Ah I don't know. I have sort of a vague idea of him being sort of a dark skinned man, ah thin, but that may have been from the paper cause I kept, the name was in my mind before that and I was, this is a real familiar name, what, how do I know him.
