The following will be a voluntary sworn statement reference to abduction/homicide that occurred on or about July 27, 1981, said offense occurring at 300 Hollywood Mall, City of Hollywood, County of Broward, State of Florida. This statement is being taken by DETECTIVE J. HOFFMAN #0038 and LIEUTENANT J.B. SMITH and SERGEANT STANDLEY of the Hollywood Police Department. This statement is being obtained from a witness identified as HARLEY, ROBERT LEE, W/M DOB: 11-20-16 who resides at Post Office Box 26, Middleburg, Florida, telephone 904-282-0492. This statement is commencing on Friday, November 18, 1983 at approximately 1012 hours.

Q. Prior to taking your statement MR. HARLEY are you aware that it is a crime under the Florida State Statutes to knowingly furnish false information while under oath?

A. Yes.

Q. As a Notary Public for the State of Florida I am going to place you under oath, okay?

A. Okay.

Q. Will you please raise your right hand? (Let the record reflect that the witness' right hand is raised.) ROBERT LEE HARLEY do you solemnly swear to tell the truth the whole truth and nothing but the truth so help you God?

A. I do.

ROBERT LEE HARLEY HAVING APPEARED BEFORE ME A NOTARY PUBLIC FOR THE STATE OF FLORIDA BROWARD COUNTY HAVING BEEN DULY SWORN DEPOSES AND STATES:

Q. For the record sir will you please state your complete given name, date of birth and home address?

A. My name?

Q. Yes sir.

A. ROBERT L. HARLEY.

Q. Date of Birth?

A. November 20, 1916.

Q. And your address?

A. P.O. Box 26, Middleburg, Florida.

Q. Telephone number?

A. 282-0492.

Q. It is my understanding sir that you are presently retired on disability, correct?

A. That's right.

Q. At this time MR. HARLEY I'd like you to discuss for me when you first married OTTIS TOOLE's mother, how long have you known OTTIS and we'll go from there?

A. I've known OTTIS ever since he was ten years old. I married his wife in his mother in 1957.

Q. Tell me the addresses you lived in Jacksonville, and the time period you lived there?

A. I know the houses, the streets but I don't know the addresses.

Q. Let's go to your last known address before the fire.

A. Day Avenue, somewhere on Day Avenue, that's the last one.

Q. How long did you live at that residence?

A. About a year a little over.

Q. So that would have been from 1980 to '81?

A. That's right.

Q. Who lived at that residence with you?

A. Me and my wife and NOVELLA and OTTIS.

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Q. Novella too?

A. Yeah, on the other side, and also Henry was there at the same time too.

Q. Henry Lee Lucas?

A. That's right.

Q. When did Henry Lee Lucas first come into contact with you?

A. I think he met him downtown at the Mission, the City Mission.

Q. Do you remember what year that was?

A. It was about three or two or three years ago anyway.

Q. Where was Ottis employed during 1979, 80, 81?

A. Well he worked for Reeves Brothers since I been going there, since I been going you know.

Q. Reeves Roofing Company?

A. That's right, yeah.

Q. What was his job there Sir?

A. He was a helper.

Q. A helper. You know what he had to do as a helper?

A. Well he used to clean up the roofs, he used to clean up the grounds, he used to carry stuff up on the roofs and stuff like that you know.

Q. Do you know if he was responsible for firing up the tar kettles ever?

A. Well he used to fire kettles for a while, yeah, not directly you know, just off and on.

Q. Okay, when he had to fire up a tar kettle, did he have to go there earlier in the morning?

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A. About 4:00 O'Clock, 3:00 O'Clock or 4:00 O'Clock in the morning.

Q. How would he gain access to the tar kettles since they were fenced in the compound?

A. He had uh, this fella, I can't think of his name, he let him in without a key, locked up you know.

Q. So Ottis would get a key from this black male?

A. That's right.

A. Or else he would go over there and let him in anyway you know.

Q. Okay, to get into the compound?

A. That's right.

Q. In 1981, prior to your wife's death, do you know what kind of vehicle Ottis owned?

A. Ottis, he didn't have no car at the time being.

Q. What about 1980?

A. Well he probably had some old car, he had so many of them.

Q. Did you ever see him operating or have possession of a black and white Cadillac, 4-door?

A. No

Q. Never saw that vehicle?

A. No

Q. Now after your wife's death, May of 1981, what happened from that point on, with yourself, what did you do, what happened to the house on Day Avenue?

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A. Well, after my wife died, I come out here to settle down for a while you know, a couple of days you know.....

Q. Right

A. Went back to the house, stayed a week, but in the meantime Ottis' wife come back there too you know and she stayed a week with me you see, then after a week's time she said well Pop I'm gonna leave and go back to town I said well you gonna leave, I'm gonna leave too you know what I mean so I come back out here and she went to town.

Q. Okay that would have been sometime in June of 81?

A. Probably so, something like there.

Q. Did there come a time that you discovered that there was property stolen out of the house on Day Avenue?

A. It was right after my wife's death.

Q. What kind of property was taken from the house?

A. Jewelry, some furniture and everything else.

Q. Did you know who took that property?

A. Probably Ottis and Lucas I reckon.

Q. What do you think the value of that property was?

A. I think it was, the property, the value of the property?

Q. Yes

A. About eight thousand dollars I think it was.

Q. You say jewelry, were there diamond rings, or gold or anything like that?

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A. Yeah, I had uh solid gold cigarete cases, stuff like that you know, solid gold watch, solid gold watch disappeared, rings, different items like that you know.

Q. Did you make an official police report with the Jacksonville Sheriff's Department about the theft?

A. Yeah but I think I didn't but this Georgia Toole did I think.

Q. Georgia Toole?

A. Yeah

Q. Now, right after that period of time, is that when Ottis went away, him and....

A. Lucas

Q. Henry Lee Lucas and Frieda Powell and Frank Powell?

A. Yeah, that's right.

Q. Do you know where they went?

A. I sure don't.

Q. Do you know what vehicle they took to make this trip?

A. An LTD Ford, an LTD Ford, 73, 4-door.

Q. Where did they go, do you know?

A. I sure don't know.

Q. Did there come a time that they came back and that they stole Howell Toole's truck?

A. They came back and took Howell Toole's truck, they taking off again, they went north somewhere, I don't know where.

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Q. They went north?

A. That's right.

Q. Do you know what month that was?

A. I sure don't.

Q. Was this still the Summer of 81?

A. Probably the latter part of 81.

Q. For the record, we have information they were up in Maryland in June of 81 or July of 81.

A. Something like that.

Q. Did there come a time that Henry and Ottis were separated and the two children were separated up in Maryland or Delaware?

A. I heard something about it but I don't know nothing about it you know.

Q. If Ottis and Henry took the jewelry from your wife's residence when she passed away, is there any pawn shops that they would have used in the Jacksonville area to get rid of the stuff?

A. I think if they would of tried it, I guess they wouldn't of tried it because I never could find none of it.

Q. Do you know of any pawn shops in the Jacksonville area that they have used in the past?

A. They used the one up there on Bay Street is all I ever know.

Q. What street?

A. Bay Street.

Q. Bay?

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A. Yeah, Bay and Jefferson, north of Jefferson or somewhere up there.

Q. Is that in the Springfield area?

A. That's downtown area.

Q. Downtown area?

A. Yeah

Q. (Lt. Smith) - That was Bay & Jefferson?

A. Yeah, somewhere over there.

Q. When Ottis came back to the Jacksonville area from the trip up north, did he tell you what happened, how he and the children got separated?

A. No he didn't, no.

Q. Did you know what happened to Frankie and Frieda Powell?

A. I didn't know until later on I found out about it but I never did know where they was at, I know they was out at Fort uh Auburndale, Florida with their mother and Stan, step-daddy you know and she committed suicide and he also, her husband put them in a foster home somewhere, that's the last I heard of them.

Q. Do you have any personal knowledge if Ottis ever had any money hidden at the house on Day Avenue or buried over at the house?

A. I don't believe so, no.

Q. That house, how was it constructed, was it on a cement slab or was it elevated off the ground?

A. It was elevated off the ground and it had a lot of dirt underneath.

Q. Could you crawl underneath the house?

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A. Oh you could crawl underneath it, it's about two foot high.

Q. What type of tools or garden equipment did you have over the house on Day Avenue?

A. Oh we had rakes, hoes and shovels and stuff like that.

Q. Did you ever see Ottis in possession of any machetes from Reeves Roofing or at your own house on Day Street?

A. I don't think so.

Q. Did he ever tell you he used machetes at his place of employment?

A. No he did not.

Q. When you refer to the Missions that he met Henry Lee Lucas at, where would that be, the Missions?

A. That was on Laura Street.

Q. Laurel?

A. Laura, L-A-U-R-A, Laura.

Q. Laura Street. Is that Mission still standing or is that the one that burnt down?

A. That's the one that burnt down.

Q. Are there any other Missions that he used to hang out at?

A. Trinity Mission.

Q. Trinity Mission.

A. On Bay Street, West Bay.

Q. West Bay, that's in the Springfield area?

A. That's the downtown area, I wouldn't call it Springfield.

Q. Ottis used to frequent that place?

A. Yeah, quite often, yeah, both of them.

Q. Is that place still standing or still in business?

A. Trinity Mission is.

Q. Did Ottis ever tell you about his trips with Henry and what they did when they traveled?

A. No he didn't, he never discussed it with me at all.

Q. Did he ever tell you about any murders he committed?

A. No, he uh, I don't think Ottis ever would I tell you the truth.

Q. We understood that he had some type of medical condition such as epilepsy, is that true?

A. He might have had two light cases of it is all I can recall of it.

Q. You recall just two incidents?

A. That's right, just mild cases of it you know, it wasn't serious you know.

Q. Was he taking medication for that?

A. I don't think he did.

Q. Was he seeing any physician for that or clinic?

A. No, I don't think so.

Q. After your wife passed away, how many times have you seen Ottis since May of 1981?

A. I've only seen Ottis but three more times since then.

Q. When was the most recent time?

Q. Would it be unusual for Ottis to pick up and leave for days or weeks at a time, then come back?

A. Oh yeah, he did that too.

Q. Quite a bit?

A. Quite a bit, yeah.

Q. Was it always with Henry or would he do it by himself?

A. He'd do it by himself sometime or with Henry, you know.

Q. What did he use for money to travel?

A. I wouldn't know, ha.

Q. Were you aware that Henry was a homosexual?

Q. When did you leave?

A. After my wife's death, you know.

Q. You never went back periodically to check on the house or the remains?

A. No, no, no. Howell Toole he went over there to nail some boards on the windows you know, stuff like that over there and as far as I know it was still standing.

A. That's about all I can tell you.
