On this date, SUBJECT, residing in Miami, Dade Cty. , Florida, after being carefully informed of his constitutional rights, signed a Polygraph Examination Statement of Consent voluntarily agreeing to a Polygraph Examination. He was examined under instrumentation for the detection of truth or deception with reference to the case mentioned above.

The reason for the examination, the function of the instrument and the procedure to follow during the testing were carefully explained. SUBJECT said he understood them clearly. The circumstances of the case were discussed. SUBJECT provided substantially the same information he had given the investigator.

SUBJECT stated he was in good health and had not taken any medication during the prior eight (8) hours.

The test questions were formulated and thoroughly explained. SUBJECT stated he understood them. He provided the answers recorded. The following relevant questions were used:

3 Polygrams using the Modified General Question Technique.

2 Polygrams using the known peak of tension technique.

1 Stim Test (Probing Peak of Tension) Technique.

A careful analysis of the test polygraph revealed N.S.D.R.

Pre-Polygraph Interview

Mr. Alejandro Marcos stated he was born in Cuba on 2/7/48. He attended school in Cuba & completed pre-University studies. Mr. Marcos arrived in the U.S. in May of 1980 via the Mariel boat lift. Mr. Marcos stated he was never in jail nor in any mental institutions. Mr. Marcos stated he was in Ft. Chafee, Ark. approx. 1 month. Mr. Marcos stated he has never received psychiatric treatment, nor suffered nervous breakdowns. Mr. Marcos stated he is in good physical health and does not suffer from any diseases. Mr. Marcos stated he has not used any drugs, medications, or alcoholic beverages in the last 8 hrs. Mr. Marcos indicated he had no involvement with the death of Adam Walsh, stated he has never been to Hollywood. Mr. Marcos stated he heard of this case by way of the news media, however, he had no participation in any way in Adam Walsh's disappearance or death. Mr. Marcos stated he has never told anyone that he killed Adam Walsh. Mr. Marcos stated he has no idea as to the cause of death of Adam Walsh.

Relevant Questions on Modified General Question Technique

3. Do you know who killed Adam Walsh?
5. Did you kill Adam Walsh?
8. Did you ever say that you had killed Adam Walsh.
9. Do you know where Adam Walsh was killed?

Questions Used for Peak of Tension (Known)?

Do you know if Adam Walsh's death was caused by:

1. A bullet fired from a firearm.
2. Being struck with a piece of iron.
3. Being struck with a base ball bat.
4. A knife wound to the back.
- * 5. Strangulation.
6. Drowning.

* Relevant, known cause.

STIM TEST

Subject Marcos selected a number from 2 to 5. By way of a probing peak of tension it was determined that subject chose the number three. Subject later confirmed he had chosen the number three.

- Order of Tests:
1. MGQT
 2. Stim Test
 3. MGQT
 4. Peak of Tension
 5. Peak of Tension
 6. MGQT. Mixed series.

Subject showed no significant deception except for question #8: "Did you ever say you had killed Adam Walsh?". Subject denied ever saying that.
